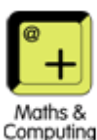

Use of ICT facilities in school

Dear Parent/Guardian,

As part of the school's support for its teaching and learning programme, we offer pupils supervised access to the Internet and e-mail. At the start of each academic year, before the school allows students to use these facilities, they must obtain parental permission by completing a **Responsible Computer and Internet Use** contract, which must be signed by both pupils and parents and returned to the school as evidence of their acceptance of the school's **Rules for Responsible ICT Use**. Copies of both are enclosed with this letter.

Various projects have proven the educational benefits of Internet and e-mail access, which enable pupils to explore a wide range of information sources, and communicate and collaborate with other learners throughout the world. Although there are concerns about children having access to inappropriate material via the Internet, the school takes a range of measures to minimise these risks.

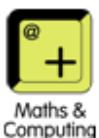
A filtering system is in operation which restricts access to inappropriate materials, student ICT activity is subject to surveillance and logging and this is soon to be further supplemented by an updated Internet safety programme for all pupils which will teach the safe and appropriate behaviours to adopt when using the Internet, e-mail and other technologies.

Although Internet use is supervised and filtered within our school, families should be aware that some pupils may find ways to access material that is inaccurate, defamatory, illegal, or potentially offensive to some people.

As with any other area, we accept that parents and guardians of minors are responsible for setting and conveying the standards that their children should follow when using media and information sources at home. During school, teachers will guide students towards appropriate material.

At home, families bear the same responsibility for guidance as they exercise with other information sources such as television, telephones, films and radio.

The school therefore supports and respects each family's right to decide whether or not to apply for access to the school's Internet facilities.



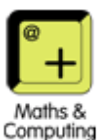
If you decide to support your child's application for access to the Internet, please read the enclosed ***Rules for Responsible ICT Use***, complete and sign the enclosed permission form, and return it to your child's form tutor as soon as possible.

You will note that the enclosed ***Rules for Responsible ICT Use*** also prohibit any interference with the school's computer equipment or attempts by students to access, change or delete files for which they do not have authorised access.

As you will understand, any interference of this kind would be taken very seriously and appropriate sanctions applied in line with the seriousness of the case.

Responsible Computer and Internet Use

RULES OF CONDUCT

*We use the school computers and Internet connection for learning.
These rules will help us to be fair to others and keep everyone safe.*

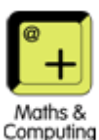
1. On the network, I will use only my own user-name and password.
2. I will not let anyone else know or use any of my school passwords.
3. I will not look at, alter or delete other people's files.
4. I will not use any unauthorised devices (e.g. pen-drives, MP3 players, etc.) on the school network without permission.
5. I will only e-mail people I know, or whom my teacher has approved.
6. The messages I send will be polite and sensible.
7. When sending e-mail, I will not give my home address, phone number, or other personal information, or arrange to meet anyone.
8. I will not use web-mail (e.g. 'Hotmail') unless I have been given personal permission to do so during *that* lesson.
9. I will not use Internet Chat (*IM*, etc.) or similar services.
10. If I see anything I am unhappy with, or I receive messages I do not like, I will tell a teacher immediately.
11. I will not attempt to access web-sites that are inappropriate and I know that the school can check my user-area and e-mails and can monitor the Internet sites I attempt to (and manage to) visit.



13. I will not make any use of ICT to bring the school into disrepute, e.g. by posting inappropriate video-clips to 'YouTube' or to social networking sites (whether from inside or outside of school) in which the school can be identified.

14. I understand that if I deliberately break these rules, I may be stopped from using the Internet and/or other ICT services and I am likely to receive other sanctions (punishments).

The school exercises the right to monitor by electronic means the use of the school's computer systems by users and to, where necessary, block access to inappropriate web-sites; intercept e-mail and to retain evidence of the possession of inappropriate materials, in circumstances where it believes unauthorised use of the school's computer system is, or may be, taking place - or the system is, or may be, being used for criminal purposes or for storing text or imagery which is unauthorised or unlawful.

School library registration – fingerprint recognition system

Books from both school libraries will soon be issued using the ‘Alice’ biometric fingerprint recognition system. This is similar to the one so successfully installed for our cashless catering system and has the same aim of improving the speed and efficiency of the service on offer to students.

Please be aware that fingerprints are not stored, and it is not possible to recreate an image from the information that is stored in the library system. The Head and Governors are happy that this does not contravene the data protection act, and that it is a sound concept.

Registration of students will be carried out at the time that books are issued commencing on Monday 21st September.

In response to this letter I would ask you to act in one of these ways:

- If you have already given permission for your son or daughter to use the school meals biometric system, and/or you are happy for your son or daughter to use the library biometric system you do not need to take any further action. Your child will be registered and books issued using the biometric system.
- If you are not willing for your son or daughter to use the library biometric system please contact the school office on either site to register your wishes, and we will be happy to make alternative arrangements for book issue.

‘PARENTPAY’ - CASHLESS PAYMENT SYSTEM FOR SCHOOL MEALS

Frequently Asked Questions

How do I use ParentPay?

The school will issue you with a unique username and password a week before the launch date. Once you receive these, just go to www.parentpay.com and login with the details. Accept the ParentPay terms and conditions, complete the Title, Forename, Surname and Email address fields in your ‘Profile’ page and **change your password and username to something memorable**. Registering your e-mail address enables us to send receipts of payments and the school can notify you easily when payments need to be made. That’s it; now you can start making hassle free, secure payments to your child’s school whenever you like.

What cards can I use?

ParentPay accepts MasterCard and Visa credit cards and Maestro, Switch, Delta, Electron, Solo and Visa debit cards. Some schools may limit the use of credit cards for some transactions; you will be informed by the school directly of any such restrictions.

Is it safe to make payments on the internet?

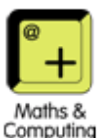
YES. In fact, it’s as safe to pay online with ParentPay as it is to use your credit card in a shop or over the phone! ParentPay uses leading technology to process your credit/debit card transactions securely. All communication with the bank is encrypted (jumbled up so no one else can read it). Neither ParentPay nor the school has access to your card details and your card details are never kept by ParentPay or the school.

How can I check that it’s secure?

Standard website addresses begin with ‘http’ whereas the address for a secure site will always begin with ‘https’. You will also see a ‘padlock’ at the bottom right of the screen. Never enter your card details or personal data on any web page whose address does not start with ‘https’.

What about our personal information?

ParentPay uses a very limited amount of information about you and your child solely for the purpose of administering your account; we do not share or give information to any other organizations. We operate under strict guidelines set out by the Data Protection Act 1998, which ensures the protection and care of personal information. This means that any information you give us electronically will only be used for the purpose that you intended.

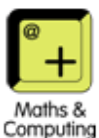

Cashless Catering System

Alperton Community School has a Cashless Catering System in place for the school meals provision since February '09. This means that students will not pay cash directly at the tills in the canteens. Instead the money paid will be credited to their individual account. The money can be paid into your child's account using one of the three options i.e., by online payment via Parent Pay **or** sending cheques to the school **or** by putting cash into the cash loader machines inside the school. This account can be accessed by students via two options either by biometric finger scanning or using a PIN number when paying for their meals in the school canteen.

There are many good reasons for using this system:

- You can be sure that the money you provide for school lunches is used for that purpose (we can even give you a print out of what food your child has purchased if you want it)
- Your child will not be carrying cash which could be lost or even worse stolen. This could eliminate any bullying for dinner money
- There is a daily 'spend limit' of £3.00 programmed into the system which can be spent at break and/or lunch time

This system protects students who are on free school meals as there is no distinction between them and the others. The school simply puts their free school meal allowance onto their account on a daily basis.

Payment Methods:

Online Payment: An Online payment service called 'ParentPay' will simplify the payment procedures for those parents who wish to prepay for their child's school meals using a debit/credit card over the internet. You have a secure online account, activated using a unique username and password; you will be prompted to change these, and to keep them safe and secure. If you do not have the login details and would like to use the online facility then please contact the school for re-issue of these details.

Cheque: Payments can be made by cheque and should be made payable to 'ABM Catering Ltd' with your child's name and form at the back of it.

Cash: You will still be able to give your child cash if you prefer. The main difference to the procedure will be that they will insert their money in the 'cash loader' units at each site which will in turn 'credit' their account. They can also check their balances on these units.

Key Stage 4 - Uniform for Year 10 and Year 11 for September 2009

I am writing to inform you of the uniform expectations for your child from September 09. The aim of having a school uniform is to develop a corporate spirit and enable students to show that they are proud to be a student of Alperton Community School by wearing their uniform smartly. It also promotes community cohesion by enabling students of all social backgrounds to dress equally; there is no pressure on parents/guardians to spend money on expensive designer items. Finally wearing a uniform prepares students for the world of work by helping them to understand that we dress to suit the situation. So, a serious student comes to school presenting the image that they are serious about their studies and not being part of a fashion parade. I hope that you recognise and support these values when you choose to send your child to Alperton and will encourage them to comply with the expectations.

The uniform remains unchanged apart from the fact that blazers will be optional for students at the upper school. The school jumper may also be replaced by a plain black jumper if desired. The school tie must be worn at all times. Trousers and skirts must be plain black. Shirts and blouses must be plain white. School shoes and not trainers are the appropriate footwear.

Outdoor coats must be removed when in the school building and should fit in with the colour code of the school. No hooded tops or jackets with large logos are allowed, even as an outdoor coat. No baseball caps are allowed in school and any other hats worn in cold weather must be removed inside the building.

Excessive jewellery should not be worn. One pair of simple ear studs and a watch are the only items of jewellery permitted. A discreet chain, especially if of religious significance, can be worn inside the shirt or blouse.

All items of this uniform can be bought at low cost in most high street clothing stores. There is no need to purchase them from the specific uniform supplier. If any parent is prevented from providing the appropriate uniform due to financial difficulties they should contact the school for assistance.

I look forward to your child continuing at Alperton for their GCSE studies without any distracting conflict about uniform. Members of the public often comment about how smart our students look and for this reason I hope some of them may choose to continue with the school jumper or blazer which look smart and bear the school crest.

Dear Parent/Guardian

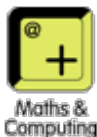

All **Alperton Community** learners now have full use of this service totally free of charge.


We believe that it is useful for learners to use a variety of learning methods in their studies and, with this in mind, we have invested in this Internet-based approach. We hope that motivation will be increased where students take a break from textbooks from time to time and 'log-in' to Sam Learning instead. All that is needed is a PC with an internet connection.

By now all students have been informed how to use **Sam Learning** through the school email system. It's very simple and learners need just three details to 'log-in':

School ID	HA0AC (HAzeroAC)
User ID	Date of birth followed by two initials; first name then last name. Example: 010885DJ is the User ID for David Jones born 1 st Aug 1985.
Password	This is initially the same as the User ID (above), but students should change their password as soon as they have logged-in for the first time.
